

The York County, Pennsylvania, Court-House Robbed—The Treasurer's Accounts Stolen.

YORK, Penn., Oct. 22.—Last March, soon after the Legislature appointed the Reauditing Committee, the Court-house here was entered and all the vouchers stolen that could implicate any of the members of the "Ring." Last night the Court-house was again entered and all the Treasurer's accounts for the past six years were stolen, together with the stub-book which contains the records of notes issued by the county. But more important than all, the Reauditor's report, which was to have been filed at the November term of the Court, containing evidence of the most gigantic frauds, was carried off.
